Lock-Down Sunday School – A 4-week series about Trusting God

Do whatever you want to make this work for you – feel free to use your own ideas/resources, change around the order, or skip things entirely.

Option 1 – Sunday School – use this as a normal Sunday School lesson, on Sunday morning (or whenever) – doing one thing from each category will take about 30minutes to an hour and half (or longer) depending on which things you choose to do.

Option 2 – Everyday Devotional – do a little everyday – break down the story into smaller chunks to focus on each day. Pick an activity or two to do each day. I recommend spending a few days learning the Bible verse & songs, if you're using those options.

Week 4- Paul & Silas (Stuck in Jail)

Lesson

<u>Under 5s</u>

- Read the story of Paul & Silas from a children's Bible (Beginner's Bible calls it "Earthquake in Prison")
- Questions:
 - Why did people put Paul and Silas into jail?
 - Why weren't Paul and Silas worried?
 - How did God rescue Paul and Silas?

<u>Over-5s</u>

- Story Options:
 - Read it from the Bible Acts 16:16-40 have everyone who is able read parts
 - Read it from a kids' Bible
 - Watch the funny version (2mins) <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=5t_3BuseTS0</u>
 - Watch the more serious version (2mins) <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=jtV2PV9n3cY</u>

- Questions (use the ones that fit your child's understanding):
 - Why were Paul and Silas arrested?
 - $\circ~$ Why do you think Paul and Silas sang and prayed in jail?
 - Do you think it was easy to praise God in jail rather than complain and feel sad?
 - How can we show the same trust in God & good attitude during lokdown?
 - What would you have done after the earthquake opened the doors?
 - What was your favourite part of the story?
 - What surprised you about this story?
 - Do you have any questions?
- Other Story Ideas (if you're telling it multiple times during the week)
 - Any of the ideas from the previous weeks will work, or...
 - Build a jail & read the story inside it, once you get to the part where they sing, have a worship time. Afterwards open the jail doors and tell the rest of the story
 - Try your hand at stop motion videos and retell the story with lego, playdough, toys, or yourselves. Find stop motion tips here:
 https://www.youtube.com/watch?v= ppedXZHhEO. I used Stop Motion Studio (found in the google play store) to make my stop motion movie. This is a good activity if you're wanting to keep older kids occupied for an hour or two. Make sure to share your movies!

Activities – do as many or as few as you want

Memory Verse:

Proverbs 3:5-6 Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him and He will direct your path.

- Say the memory verse together in different voices let everyone have a turn choosing what kind of voice to use. Try squeaky, deep, posh, whispering, shouting, or whatever your imagination comes up with
- You might want to only do half the verse if you think your child will struggle with learning the whole thing at once.

If your family is already confident with Prov 3:5-6, find a new one together – google
 'Bible verses about Trust' if you need some ideas

Prayer Time:

- Make a 'prayer chain' write things you are grateful for, praises to God, or prayer requests on strips of paper. Staple or tape them together in a paper chain

Games/Playtime:

- Set up a jail area then take turns capturing each other and escaping
- Turn the above pretend play game into a game of jail tag for older kids those tagged must go to jail and wait to be rescued by another player
- Have a praise party turn the music up LOUD and dance & sing
